“MUSIC TO OUR EARS”

When I joined Masonry, I was excited to be a part of a group of men for whom I had respect and wanted to be like them. They were kind, gentle, trustworthy and stood upright in their lives. They were not perfect, but they revered and trusted in God for guidance in how to love humanity. They learned more than the ritual and secrets of Masonry; they lived Masonry. I grew up in a family that taught love of God, country, and family, with charity to all. As an Eagle Scout and a DeMolay, Masonry was a natural progression in learning to love God, being friendly, courteous, honoring one's parents, helping others, and being trustworthy and honest. For me it was a recipe for gaining a full and respectable life.

Masonry for many is a part of learning how to live a quality life that is pleasing to their God, inspiring to others, and giving respect. When Masonry's principles augment one's religious practices and complement the enjoyment of the arts and sciences, the formula for a meaningful and rewarding life is even broader. I appreciate it when I hear or read words that reinforce my moral and spiritual beliefs and encourage me to be a kinder, more productive person. I am a musician and especially enjoy musicals that combine deep philosophical truths with moving, powerful music. For a Masonic musician, it is getting life lessons set to a pleasing melody.

Recently, the Public Broadcasting Service presented a special on the 80th Anniversary of the musicals written by the team of Rogers & Hammerstein. Some of us grew up listening to *Oklahoma*, *Carousel* (both of which were way before my time), and *The Sound of Music*. In *Carousel* there is a profound song entitled “You’ll Never Walk Alone,” which was written in 1945, just prior to the end of World War II. The words seem to reflect the anxiety of the time and the reassurance that our God is with us, when it says in part:

‘When you walk through a storm, hold your head up high

And don’t be afraid of the dark,

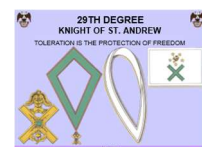
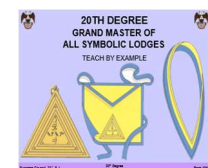
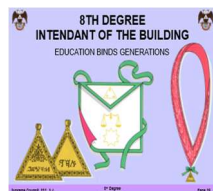
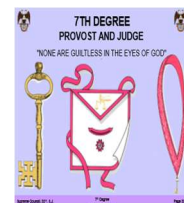
At the end of the storm is a golden sky

When we hear those lyrics, it should strike a familiar chord of Masonic teaching that the love of the Grand Architect of the Universe is always with us to provide strength, direction and comfort. Hearing these words beside our existing beliefs is reinsuring to us that our path is sound and sure.

The second song that touches an inspirational emotion is “*Climb Ev’ry Mountain*” from *The Sound of Music*. Part of the lyrics that poetically express guidance for achievement are:

*“Climb ev’ry mountain,
Search high and low,
Follow ev’ry byway,
Ev’ry path you know.*

*Climb ev’ry mountain,
Ford ev’ry stream,
Follow ev’ry rainbow,
Till you find your dream!”*

Though the setting for this song is based upon a budding romance, the words are easily applied to a deeper and enduring meaning. In our Masonic life, how many times are we just spectators to learning the principles? We have the words of the ritual and know the meaning, but does it go beyond that? These lyrics instruct us to climb every mountain, follow every byway and path that we know. In the blue lodge we receive valuable instruction for a fuller Masonic life, but in Scottish Rite, we are pushed to put that information into action--just do it. Do not let up on learning more healthy life practices; do not let your learning fall into stagnation. If we fail to actively embrace the teachings and make them an active part of our life, at best the Masonic light we gained will only shine inward and will be of little value to the world. The strength of Masonry is to embrace it in your life, expose it to the world on every mountain top, on every pathway and byway, past every stream of impediment, and to follow your rainbow until you find your dream.

Masonry and music have traditionally been in harmony from Mozart to Sousa to Brad Paisley. Enjoy the journey of finding Masonic principles not only in the lodge room but in the concert hall. It is there for your enlightenment.
